GREAT HALL PROJECT OVERVIEW



- Enhance security of TSA checkpoints
- Increase capacity of the terminal built for 50 million annual passengers
- Improve operational efficiency and passenger flow
- Enhance passenger experience
- Separated into three phases:
 - Phase 1 (completed)
 - Phase 2 (in progress)
 - Completion Phase (in progress)



THREE YEARS OF SUCCESS



- Completed Phase 1 on time and approximately \$25 million under budget
- Started Phase 2 less than a year and a half after restarting the project
- Nearing completion of Phase 2 with the West Security Checkpoint scheduled to open in Q1 2024
- Started construction of the East Security Checkpoint as part of the completion phase
- Revealed conceptual designs of the Center of Equity and Excellence in Aviation
- Meeting or exceeding nearly all MBWE goals
 - Contracting with nearly 120 MWBE firms between four prime companies



PHASE 1



- Created an additional 31,000 square feet of space and renovated 158,500 square feet
- Modernized ticket lobbies with automated self-bag drops for United, Southwest and Frontier airlines
- Four new and upgraded restrooms, escalators and elevators, HVAC
- More spacious and efficient passenger flow
- Completed on time and under budget in Nov. 2021



PHASE 2




- Constructs the new Level 6 West Security Checkpoint
 - 17 lanes with improved technology and a new queuing concept for more effective and efficient security
- Installs a triple escalator to move passengers directly down to train platform
- Constructed a curbside escalator between Levels 5 and 6 on the westside
- Scheduled to be complete in Q1 2024


PHASE 2 – FUTURE POST SECURITY WEST SIDE DEN

GREAT HALL PROJECT – COMPLETION PHASE DEN




- Builds security checkpoint on Level 6 in the northeast corner of the terminal
- New airline check-in facilities on south end of Level 6
- New meet/greet area for domestic and international arrivals
- Constructs the Center for Equity and Excellence in Aviation

CENTER OF EQUITY & EXCELLENCE IN AVIATION



- Revealed conceptual renderings in Nov. 2022
- Design is currently underway with construction starting in late 2023
- MWBE Studio Completiva, is the lead designer
- MWBE Sky Blue Builders is the general contractor



CONCESSIONS OPPORTUNITIES



- Significant concession space on Level 5 throughout the terminal with an estimated 12 individual locations and an estimated 18,000 total available square feet
- Activation at the entry from Hotel and Transit Plaza entrance on Level 5
- Design will explore additional space for mobile concession opportunities throughout the terminal
- All concessions opportunities in the Jeppesen Terminal will be pre-security









SUMMARY



- In less than two years, complete Phase 1 on time and approximately \$25M under budget while also starting construction of Phase 2
- The first new security checkpoint on the west side is on schedule to be completed in Q1 2024 with the second checkpoint complete by mid-2026
- The design and construction of the Center of Equity and Excellence in Aviation is being led by MWBE firms and construction is scheduled to start late this year
- DEN continues to look for opportunities to improve processes and look for efficiencies in the project and is working closely with all stakeholders to balance operational needs
- The project is currently on schedule and within budget
