BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Pedestrian Mall Local Maintenance District upon the real property, exclusive

- **Section 1.** Upon consideration of the recommendation of the Manager of Public Works that an ordinance be enacted for the purpose of assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall, for the upcoming year, upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited the Council finds, as follows:
- (a) A local maintenance district providing for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall, was created by Ordinance No. 838, Series of 1998;
- (b) The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall is \$32,000.00, which amount the Manager of Public Works has the authority to expend for the purposes stated herein;
- (c) The Manager of Public Works has complied with all provisions of law relating to the publishing of notice to the owners of real properties to be assessed and to all persons interested generally, and the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization has heard and determined all written complaints and objections, if any, filed with the Manager of Public Works;
- (d) The portion of the 2014 annual costs for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall to be assessed against the properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited are \$30,944.87;
- (e) The portion of the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall to be borne by the City and County of Denver is \$1,055.13; and
- (f) The real property within the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall will be benefited in an amount equal to or in excess of the amount to be assessed against said property because of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of said Pedestrian Mall.

- 1 Section 2. The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and
- 2 replacement of the Broadway Viaduct Pedestrian Mall to be assessed against the real
- 3 properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited are hereby approved.
