  - a. Scope of Work

This request is to appropriate \$1,448,993.19 in the Environmental Services Enterprise Fund Capital Project Fund (78400) to enable and complete a cash transfer and appropriation to Underground Storage Tank Subfund (78410). The purpose of the Underground Storage Tank (UST) program is to monitor and remediate city-owned underground storage tanks per state law. The UST program was mandated by State Legislation in 1989. The Environmental Quality Division coordinates, through its consultants and contractors, for removal of leaking and otherwise obsolete storage tanks from City owned property, and remediation of contaminated groundwater. The City is reimbursed from the Colorado State Petroleum Storage Trust Fund for a portion of the eligible costs of removal and remediation work completed at a particular site. This request is to transfer cash to complete upcoming remedial and tank replacement work in 2012.
