- Updated in 2022 to:
 - Clarify ballot order and designation for different types of measures
 - Referred measures: 2A 2Z; Initiatives/referenda: 300 399
 - Specify when Clerk may reuse letters and numerals
 - § 15-9 (6): "Only after a referred ordinance is numbered 2Z, or an initiative or referendum is numbered 399, may the clerk and recorder reuse numbers."

Potential for voter confusion

- We anticipate more than three referred measures on the November 2025 ballot.
- Under the current law, we would designate the first three measures as 2X, 2Y, and 2Z. We would then restart the series at 2A.
- Ballot order (if, for example, we have 6 measures):
 2X, 2Y, 2Z, 2A, 2B, 2C.



Proposed fix

• Amend § 15-9:

- "If the total number of referred measures certified for the ballot in an upcoming election is greater than the remaining letters in the series, the clerk and recorder shall restart the series by designating the first referred measure for that election as 2A."
- "If the total number of initiatives or referenda certified for the ballot in an upcoming election is greater than the remaining numerals in the series, the clerk and recorder shall restart the series by designating the first initiative or referendum for that election as 300."

Bill language

- (6) The clerk and recorder shall number municipal ballot measures consecutively starting from the last numeral and letter, or numeral, used in any previous election until 2Z or 399 is used. Only Except as stated in subsection (7) of this section, only after a referred ordinance is numbered 2Z, or an initiative or referendum is numbered 399, may the clerk and recorder reuse numbers or letters.
- (7) Notwithstanding the language of subsection (6) of this section:
 - a. If the total number of referred measures certified for the ballot in an election is greater than the remaining letters in the series, the clerk and recorder shall restart the series by designating the first referred measure for that election as 2A.
 - b. If the total number of initiatives or referenda certified for the ballot in an election is greater than the remaining numerals in the series, the clerk and recorder shall restart the series by designating the first initiative or referendum for that election as 300.
