5. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who's involved

a. Scope of Work

The proposed resolution is being requested to evidence the City's intent to utilize a portion of the City's Private Activity Bond Volume Cap Allocation for the purpose of financing multifamily housing by Century Development at 2300 Welton Street. The affordability election related to Private Activity Bonds will be 40% of the units at 60% Area Median Income (AMI). The State of Colorado's Department of Local Affairs has allotted Private Activity Volume Cap Allocation to the City. This resolution allows for the use of \$23,000,000 to be applied in 2013, consistent with Colorado statutes and the Internal Revenue Code.
