The State of Colorado's Department of Local Affairs has allotted more than sufficient Private Activity Volume Cap Allocation to the City for this purpose. This resolution allows for the use of \$16,000,000 to be applied in 2013, consistent with Colorado statutes and the Internal Revenue Code.
