Business, Workforce & Sustainability

- BR14- 0402 Approves a lease agreement through 12-31-16 with Republic Airlines, Inc. for use of facilities at Denver International Airport to support commercial flight operations (PLANE-201314559-00).
- BR14- 0410 Approves a no-cost extension of the contract with Premisys Support Group, Inc. for two years (through 5-1-16) to provide on-call services for design, documentation, and inspection of voice and data networks at Denver International Airport (CE15005).
- BR14- 0409 Approves a three-year \$586,449 contract with Ultra Electronic Airport Systems, Inc. to replace the existing gate management system at Denver International Airport (201208409).

Government & Finance

- BR14- 0404 Approves a sub-sublease of 209 square feet of office space at 1031 13th Street leased by the City from GPAC, Inc. to Kevin Taylor Catering, LLC through 8-31-15 for \$2,096.90.
- BR14- 0399 Approves the sale of 750 square feet of vacant City-owned land at approximately 3923 Alcott Street to Depot Street II Company for \$5,000 in Council District 1.

Land Use, Transportation & Infrastructure

- RR14- 0405 Dedicates a parcel of land as public right-of-way as a public alley bounded by West 25th Avenue, West 26th Avenue, Irving Street, and Julian Street in Council District 1.
- RR14- 0407 Relinquishes a portion of an easement at North Ivy Street north of 8th Avenue in Council District 5.

RR14- Vacates a portion of right-of-way adjacent to 4451, 4455, and 4471
0408 Cahita Court with reservation in Council District 9.

Councilmembers receive the consent agendas for review and have until Thursday at noon to request that an item be scheduled for Committee discussion.
