A BILL

For an ordinance repealing the requirement to include a “worker without authorization” clause in city contracts, and related provisions, from the Denver Revised Municipal Code.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Division 5 of Article IV of Chapter 20, D.R.M.C., is repealed as follows:

DIVISION 5. - CONFIRMATION OF LAWFUL EMPLOYMENT STATUS BY CITY CONTRACTORS

Sec. 20-90. – Purpose.

~~In accordance with HB 21-1075, codified at § 8-17.5-101, et seq., C.R.S., as amended, the State of Colorado prohibited political subdivisions of the state from entering into or renewing any public contract for services with a contractor who knowingly employs or subcontracts with a worker without authorization to perform work under the contract. Among other things, HB 21-1075 requires contractors to confirm the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired to perform work under the public contract for services through the federal E-verify program. The purpose of this division 5 is to clarify and confirm the applicability of the requirements of HB 21-1075 to certain contracts entered into by the City and County of Denver. This division is also intended to provide supplemental local procedures for enforcing the requirements of HB 21-1075 in regard to city contractors.~~

Sec. 20-90.1. – Definitions.

~~As used in this division 5, unless the context otherwise requires:~~

- ~~(1) *Auditor* means the auditor of the City and County of Denver.~~
- ~~(2) *E-verify program* means the electronic employment verification program created in Public Law 104-208 and expanded in Public Law 108-156, as amended, and jointly administered by the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration, or its successor program.~~
- ~~(3) *CDLE* means the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment.~~
- ~~(4) *Contract* means:~~

1 a. ~~Any public contract for services between the city and a contractor within the meaning~~
2 ~~of section 8-17.5-101(6), C.R.S., as amended; or~~

3 b. ~~Any contract or a purchase authorization between the city and a contractor for~~
4 ~~construction, alteration, improvement, repair, maintenance or demolition of any public building or~~
5 ~~public work by or on behalf of the city.~~

6 (5) ~~Contractor means a person having a contract with the city.~~

7 (6) ~~Newly hired for employment means hired to work in the United States since the~~
8 ~~effective date of the contract.~~

9 **Sec. 20-90.2. - Verification and certification of employment eligibility under city contracts.**

10 (a) ~~Prior to executing a contract, each prospective contractor shall certify that, at the time~~
11 ~~of the certification, it does not knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization who~~
12 ~~will perform work under the contract and that the contractor will participate in the e-verify program in~~
13 ~~order to confirm the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment to~~
14 ~~perform work under the contract.~~

15 (b) ~~Each contract shall include a provision that the contractor shall not:~~

16 (1) ~~Knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization to perform work~~
17 ~~under the contract; or~~

18 (2) ~~Enter into a contract with a subcontractor that fails to certify to the contractor that the~~
19 ~~subcontractor shall not knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization to perform~~
20 ~~work under the contract.~~

21 (c) ~~Each contract shall also include the following provisions:~~

22 (1) ~~A provision stating that the contractor has confirmed the employment eligibility of all~~
23 ~~employees who are newly hired for employment to perform work under the contract through~~
24 ~~participation in the e-verify program;~~

25 (2) ~~A provision that prohibits the contractor from using the e-verify program procedures to~~
26 ~~undertake pre-employment screening of job applicants while the contract is being performed and~~
27 ~~that otherwise requires the contractor to comply with any and all federal requirements related to use~~
28 ~~of the e-verify program including, by way of example, all program requirements related to employee~~
29 ~~notification and preservation of employee rights;~~

30 (3) ~~A provision that, if the contractor obtains actual knowledge that a subcontractor~~
31 ~~performing work under the contract knowingly employs or contracts with a worker without~~
32 ~~authorization, the contractor shall be required to:~~

1 a. ~~Notify the subcontractor and the city within three (3) days that the contractor has actual~~
2 ~~knowledge that the subcontractor is employing or contracting with a worker without authorization;~~
3 ~~and~~

4 b. ~~Terminate the subcontract with the subcontractor if within three (3) days of receiving~~
5 ~~the notice required pursuant to sub-subparagraph a. of this subparagraph (3) the subcontractor does~~
6 ~~not stop employing or contracting with the worker without authorization; except that the contractor~~
7 ~~shall not terminate the contract with the subcontractor if during such three (3) days the subcontractor~~
8 ~~provides information to establish that the subcontractor has not knowingly employed or contracted~~
9 ~~with a worker without authorization.~~

10 (4) ~~A provision that requires the contractor to comply with any reasonable request by the~~
11 ~~CDLE or the auditor made in the course of an investigation that the CDLE is undertaking pursuant~~
12 ~~to the authority established in section 8-17.5-102, C.R.S., as amended, or that the auditor is~~
13 ~~undertaking pursuant to section 20-90.3.~~

14 (d) ~~If a contractor violates a provision of the contract required pursuant to subsections (b)~~
15 ~~or (c) of this section, the city may terminate the contract for a breach of the contract. If the contract~~
16 ~~is so terminated, the contractor shall be liable for actual and consequential damages to the city. Any~~
17 ~~such termination of a contract due to a violation of this section may also, at the discretion of any city~~
18 ~~department or agency responsible for soliciting contract bids and proposals, constitute grounds for~~
19 ~~disqualifying the violator from submitting bids or proposals for future contracts with the city.~~

20 **Sec. 20-90.3. - Powers of the auditor.**

21 (a) ~~The auditor may investigate whether a contractor is complying with the contract~~
22 ~~provisions required pursuant to section 20-90.2. The auditor may conduct on-site inspections where~~
23 ~~a contract is being performed, request and review documentation that proves the citizenship of any~~
24 ~~person performing work on the contract, or take any other reasonable steps that are necessary to~~
25 ~~determine whether a contractor is complying with the provisions of the contract required pursuant~~
26 ~~to section 20-90.2. The auditor shall receive complaints of suspected violations of a provision of a~~
27 ~~contract required pursuant to section 20-90.2 and shall have discretion to determine which~~
28 ~~complaints, if any, are to be investigated.~~

29 (b) ~~The auditor shall notify the head of the department or agency responsible for~~
30 ~~administering the contract if the auditor suspects that there has been a breach of a provision in the~~
31 ~~contract required pursuant to section 20-90.2.~~
