6. General description/background of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:

The public process to name this portion of Weir Gulch began in November 2015 when the neighborhood group Concerned Citizens of Barnum voted to support the naming of the parcel after Ruth Lucille Dreiling. The petition was submitted and championed by Councilman Paul López' Office. The petition included 745 complete signatures (245 more than required) and four letters or emails of support, including letters from Councilman Paul López; Concerned Citizens for Barnum President, Kaye Boeke; Officer Dean Christopherson of the Denver Police Dept. Community Relations Division; and family member Deborah Dreiling. Ruth "Lucille" Dreiling was a longtime resident of the Barnum West neighborhood who was instrumental in the creation of Weir Gulch Park. Some of Mrs. Dreiling's efforts included the organization of Boy Scouts to plant trees and clean up the gulch; and initiating the creation of a diversion program to help clean up debris that often landed in the gulch.
