



Denver History with Non-Financial ROW Licenses

- Denver Bike Sharing "BCycle"
 - No charge for commercial access to ROW
 - No charge for Tier III permits for docking station
- Operator/Permit Holder Denver Bike Sharing (Non-Profit)
- Equipment Provider/Vendor BCycle/Trek (For-Profit)
- City provided annual subsidy ranging up to \$400,000 in 2019



Cost to Operators for Licenses – Comparisons

- Denver Pilot Permit Fee Revenue: \$185,000
- Austin, TX Fee at Equivalent Fleet Size: \$300,000*
- Seattle, WA Fee at Equivalent Fleet Size: \$450,000
- Minneapolis, MN Fee at Equivalent Fleet Size: \$600,000

Cost to Operators for Licenses

Value of Free/Subsidized Rides for Denver Residents: \$14,750,000

Value of Infrastructure/Education Investments:

\$10,900,000



Infrastructure Permitting Costs

- Tier II Encroachment Permits \$2,100 + \$200 annual fee
- Tier III Encroachment Permits \$2,400 + \$200 annual fee
- Standard On-Street Corral \$1,000 five-year permit



Cost of Violation of License

- 10% Reduction for 30 Days (Loss of 21,000 rides) \$68,250
- 25% Reduction for 30 Days (Loss of 52,500 rides) **\$170,625**
- Suspension for 30 Days (Loss of 210,000 rides) \$682,500
- Administrative Citation Fee Schedule:
 - o First Offense \$150
 - Second Offense \$500
 - Subsequent Offenses \$999



Potential Annual TNC/SOV Trip Reductions

2.5m trips/year, 30% TNC/SOV replacement

766,500 trips/919,800 miles
