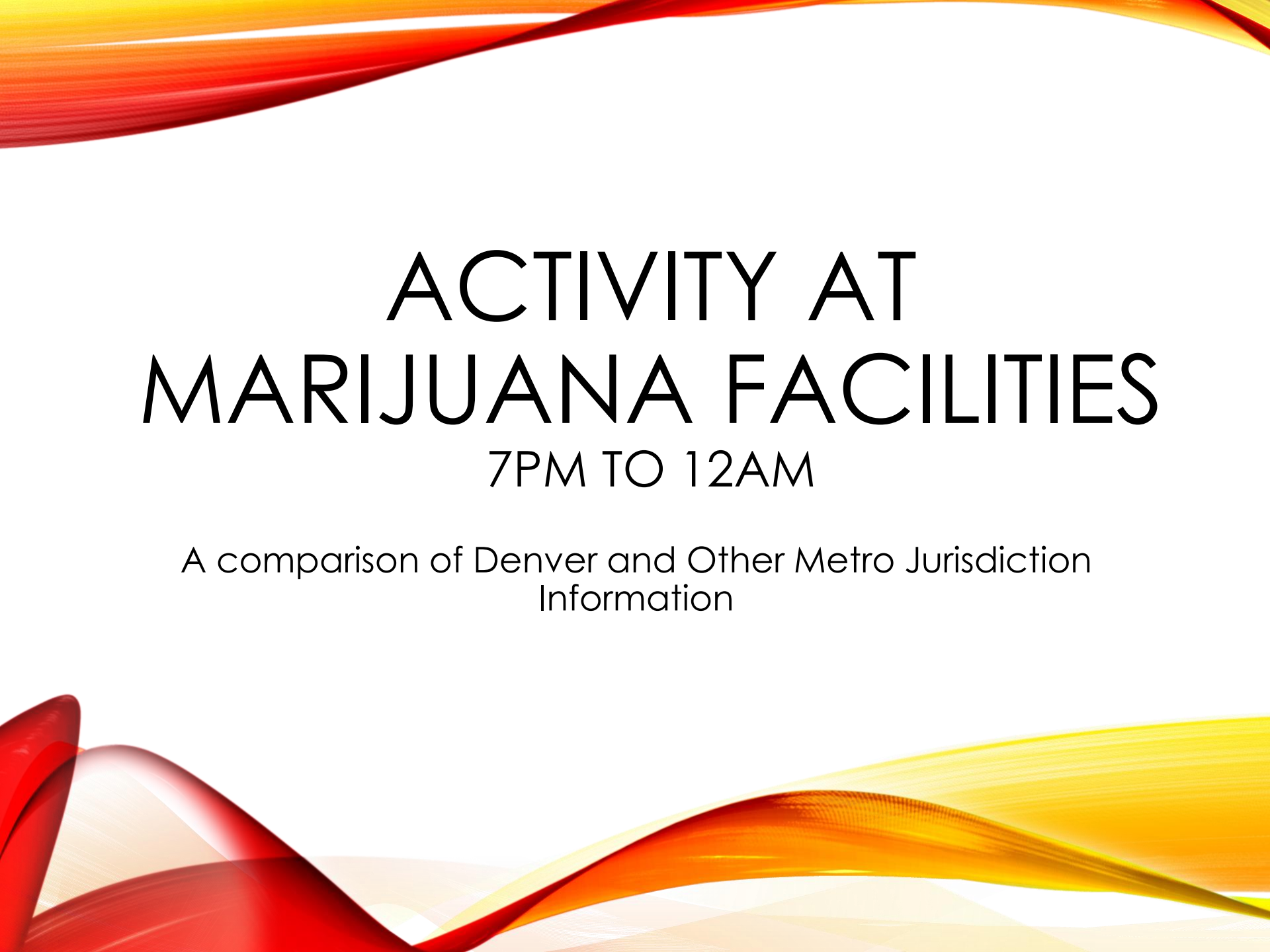

- Rate 2.3/facility
- Burglary is largest driver

- 103 Crimes
- 18% of all crime at facilities
- Rate of 0.4/facility
- Criminal Mischief largest % at that time

POTENTIAL IMPACT OF EXTENDING HOURS

Predict a Possible Increase of 6% in Total Crime at Marijuana Dispensaries

- Forecast of increase of Larceny (shoplift) by approximately 36%
- Burglary would likely remain steady as those are planned crimes vs. crimes of opportunity
- Business Robbery and Street Robbery would likely see a small increase as the hours of opportunity are increased – though these are rare events which should not be estimated based on the small numbers
