Congratulations! On behalf of Attorney General Eric Holder, I am pleased to inform you that the COPS Office has approved your agency's request for funding in the amount of \$500,000 under the COPS Technology Program. Enclosed in this packet is your grant award. **The award document must be signed and returned to the COPS Office within 90 days from the date of this letter to officially accept your grant.** Beginning on the reverse side of the grant award is a list of conditions that apply to your grant. You should read and familiarize yourself with these conditions. The official start date of your grant is December 16, 2009. Therefore, you can be reimbursed for approved expenditures made on or after this date. Please carefully review the Financial Clearance Memorandum included in your award package to determine your approved budget, as some of your requested items may not have been approved by the COPS Office during the budget review process, and grant funds may only be used for approved items. Also, please be aware that any vendor or contractor who participated in drafting your grant application may not receive federal funding for any procurement under this award.

In granting COPS funding, we consider whether grant applicants and recipients are in compliance with federal civil rights law. A determination of noncompliance could lead to a denial of assistance, an award of assistance conditioned on remedial steps being taken, or a suspension of grant payments. We are aware that the Department of Justice is conducting a civil rights investigation of your law enforcement agency. We have been advised that your agency is cooperating with this investigation, and we have taken that into account in deciding to approve your grant application.
