15	corporate limits of the City and County of Denver to at fault non-resident drivers involved in vehicle		
16	accidents on State highways within the City and Co	unty; and	
17	Whereas, the costs of providing Fire Departm	nent emergency services to at fault non-resident	
18	drivers are being disproportionately borne by the re	sidents of the City and County of Denver; and	
19	Whereas, the establishment of an emergency	response cost recovery program is of the utmost	
20	importance to the promotion of the general welfare	and safety of the people of Denver in order to	
21	recover the cost of emergency services provided by	the City and County of Denver to at fault non-	
22	resident drivers; and		
23	Whereas, the City and County of Denver ma	y charge a fee to recover the reasonable costs	
24	borne by the City and County of Denver for the cos	of providing emergency services necessary to	
25	protect the public health and safety associated with r	notor vehicle accidents on State Highways within

27	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE	COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF

29	Section 1. Sections 17-1 through 17-4 ar	e hereby added to Chapter 17 of the Revised	
30	Municipal Code pertaining to Emergency Vehicles	in the City and County of Denver, to read as	
31	follows:		
32	Sec. 17-1. Establishment of Emergency R	esponse Cost Recovery Program.	
33	There is hereby created an emergency servi	ces response cost recovery program.	
34	Sec. 17-2. Definitions.		

The following words and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them:

- (1) *Driver* means any person who operates a motor vehicle and when so operating is subject to the law and any duty imposed by law in the operation of the motor vehicle.
- (2) *Emergency service(s)* means service(s) provided by the Denver Fire Department for the purpose of ensuring public health, safety, and welfare within the City and County of Denver.
- (3) *Non-resident* means a person who does not have a principal or primary home or place of abode in the City and County of Denver or any other jurisdiction where the Denver Fire Department provides services by contract.
- (4) *Incident* shall include, but shall not be limited to, motor vehicle accidents, collisions, motor vehicle fires, rescues, cause and origin investigations and motor vehicle extrications.
- (5) Fault shall mean that a driver received a traffic citation as a result of a traffic incident and was subsequently found guilty or plead guilty to a charge deriving from the citation.
- (6) State Highways shall include federal-aid primary roads, federal-aid secondary roads, and the interstate system as defined by Colorado law.

Sec. 17-3. Fees for Services; Fee Schedule.

(1) Fee Schedule Adoption

The Denver City Council authorizes the Manager of Safety to adopt and amend, from time to time, a schedule of fees for emergency services provided to at fault non-resident drivers as described in this section.

(2) Fund Account

All fees collected shall be paid to the Manager of Finance and credited to a separate fund to defray the costs of providing Denver Fire Department emergency services.

(3) Fee Schedule and Assessment

The Manager of Safety, his or her designee, or third- party billing service, is hereby authorized to charge and recover all emergency service costs associated with motor vehicle incidents caused by at fault, non-resident drivers on State Highways within the City and County of Denver. The Manager of Safety or his or her designee will determine the schedule of fees for emergency services provided by the Denver Fire Department, which may, from time to time, be amended by the Manager of Safety. The fees shall be based upon the cost of the incident response by the Fire Department and shall not exceed the actual cost to provide such services. If the fee is not paid, the Fire Chief may send the bill for the fee to collection, and fees and costs of collection under Section 53-4 of D.R.M.C. may be
