Business, Workforce & Sustainability

- RR14-0054 Approves the Mayoral appointment of Connie O'Murray to the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District for a term effective immediately and expiring December 31, 2016.
- BR14-0064 Adds \$140,000 to the alarm management revenue contract with PMAM through the end of the contract in December 2014 for administering the City's burglar alarm system, issuing and renewing permits, and tracking false alarms for a total contract amount of \$780,000 since 2010. The vendor receives a 12% fee on total revenue collected, revenue has exceeded projections to date, and the contract is expected to be rebid in the next round (CE05013-02).

Government & Finance

- BR14-0059 Changes the pay grade of Director of Environmental Programs from 818-E to 819-E, and abolishes the Manager 1 and Manager 2 classifications in the Classification and Pay Plan for City employees.
- BR14-0060 Changes the title from Undersheriff to Sheriff in the City employee Classification and Pay Plan.
- BR14-0061 Revises the Short Range, Community Rate, and Training & Intern pay schedules and changes the pay grade for Golf Starter/Ranger, Mayor's Youth Worker, Recreation Aide, and Usher to coincide with the State increase in minimum wage.
- BR14-0062 Changes emergency purchasing procedures per the recommendations of a recent audit and raises the dollar level not subject to bidding procedures from \$5,000 to \$10,000.
- BR14-0065 Approves a \$1,000,000 master purchase order with Neve's Uniforms & Equipment, Inc. for uniforms for the Denver Fire Department (UNIFORMS_DFD__0006A0112).

Health, Safety, Education & Services

- RR14-0057 Approves the Mayoral appointment of Mitchell McKee to the Denver Early Childhood Council for a term effective immediately and expiring on June 30, 2016, or until a successor is duly appointed.

Land Use, Transportation & Infrastructure

- BR14-0066 Approves a contract with TransCore ITS for \$921,101.33 for the installation of a new centralized traffic signal control system at the Traffic Management Center (201314013).
- BR14-0067 Waives the requirement that contracts above \$500,000 in the annual program of the Department of Public Works be individually approved by City Council.
- RR14-0044 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way as a public alley located between Logan St., Grant St., 7th Ave., and 6th Ave. in Council District 10.
- RR14-0045 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way at W. Mexico Ave. located near the intersection of S. Irving St. in Council District 2.
- RR14-0046 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public alley located between Blake St., Walnut, 40th Ave., and 38th Ave. in Council District 8.
- RR14-0047 Dedicates a parcel of land as an alley, located north of Harvard Gulch between S. Franklin St. and S. Humboldt St. in Council District 7.
- RR14-0048 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way as W. Florida Ave. located near the intersection of S. Knox Ct. in Council District 2.
- RR14-0049 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way at S. Garfield St. located near the intersection of Iliff Ave. in Council District 6.
- RR14-0050 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way at S. Grove St. between W. Jewell Ave. and W. Bails Pl. in Council District 2.
- RR14-0051 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way at W. Bails Pl. between S. Grove St. and S. Irving St. in Council District 2.
- RR14-0052 Dedicates a parcel of land as a public right-of-way at S. Hooker St. between W. Bails Pl. and W. Jewell Ave. in Council District 2.
