## 2024 Budget Goals

#### **2024 Base Budget Philosophy**

- Creating new jobs. Reskilling Denver's workforce into emerging and in-demand jobs.
  - Key Metric: Jobs influenced by DEDO, Leverage of DEDO Business Development Investments, Total employment
- Strengthening the growth and resiliency of small business and nonprofits
  - Key Metric: Leverage of DEDO Business Development Investments
- Supporting the revitalization of downtown and Denver's NEST neighborhoods through targeted interventions to include activation and placemaking
  - Key Metric: Leverage of DEDO Business Development Investments, # of Individuals and businesses receiving support in NEST neighborhoods
- Supporting public investment with equity-based programming
  - Key Metric: DSBO awards and payments to certified firms



## Addressing Inequities

#### **DEDO Addressing Inequities:**

The Herman Malone Fund: Announced in 2022, Denver now dedicates 1% of its retail marijuana sales tax revenue to the Herman Malone Fund (Special Revenue Fund), which is intended to expand access to venture capital for BIPOC+ Denver startups and early-stage companies.

#### Impact in less than one year:

- \$1.2M invested in BIPOC+ companies
- 132 BIPOC+ companies supported with back-office support and technical assistance
- 12 investments through equity, debt and revenue financing

#### Communities Served:

Historic inequities and systemic marginalization continue to prevent Denver's underserved business owners from scaling to sustainable growth and building multi-generational wealth. These challenges primarily stem from decades of a lack of access to capital – ex: only ~1% of all venture capital is awarded to black founders (barrons.com). To address this inequity, DEDO has partnered with the New Community Transformation Fund-Denver to expand access to venture capital for diverse-owned Denver startups and early-stage companies located in the City and County of Denver.



## General Fund Expenses, Revenues, and FTEs








