Requested Council Action | CB24-1492

City Council approval of the following:

A rescission of \$6,020,000 from General Fund contingency and transfers to the Denver Sheriff's Department, Department of Transportation and Infrastructure, Office of Municipal Public Defender, and City Council to address unbudgeted needs.





General Fund Contingency

The City Charter requires that the proposed budget for the General Fund shall include no less than two percent of total estimated expenditures for unbudgeted expenditures. Fiscal Policy outlines criteria that include:

- An unexpected event such as a natural disaster or accident
- Large unappropriated payouts or personnel costs such as retirement payout or midyear salary adjustments that cannot be absorbed by agency appropriation
- Unfunded mandates as a result of legislation
- Planned one-time expenditures that advance a programmatic or financial outcome

Denver Sheriff's Department (DSD)	Collective bargaining increases	\$2,700,000
Dept. of Transportation & Infrastructure (DOTI)	Fleet (fuel, outsourcing, parts), parking credit card fees, street lighting, and pay equity adjustments	\$2,500,000
Office of Municipal Public Defender (OMPD)	Personnel costs associated with the juvenile representation ordinance that passed mid-year, higher than anticipated conflict counsel contract	\$750,000
City Council	Central Services	\$70,000
