This immersive two-week program provides recruits with a comprehensive experience, including:

- Classroom Training: Delve into the complex history of policing in the U.S. and Denver. Participate in seminars on police interactions with the LGBTQ+ community, religious organizations, youth engagement, trauma-informed practices, and more.
- Community Visits: Explore Denver's diverse neighborhoods to understand the unique cultures, challenges, and strengths of its communities.
- Engaging with Underserved Communities: Connect with marginalized groups and formerly incarcerated individuals, through discussions, street outreach, and informal conversations.
- Capstone Project: Reflect on the program through a team debrief and a capstone paper, emphasizing personal growth, community insights, and strategies for building trust.
