Purpose: La Raza Services, Inc. (SDLR) is to work in conjunction with the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless(CCH) and the Urban League of Metropolitan Denver (ULMD) to implement and operate the Transition from Jail-to-Community (TJC) program to reduce recidivism in Denver County through community collaboration that promotes access to services, resources and supportive relationships to persons prior to release from detention or jail continued through reentry and transition into the community.

Scope of services with performance bench marks include the following:

1. Scope of Services include the implementation of the Transition from Jail-to-Community (TJC) model by providing services, resources and supportive relationships for medium-to-high risk offenders entering jail and continuing through their reentry process back to the community. Services and resources are to be provided to Denver County men and women residents and/or individuals returning to Denver upon release.
 - a. Services, resources and supportive relationships include but are not limited to the following:
 - i. Utilize screenings and assessments to create a transition plan while the participant is still incarcerated and provide targeted interventions for successful release.
 - ii. Provide Pre-release and Post-release service delivery based on specific needs such as Trauma/PTSD treatment, Gender-specific treatment services, Parenting Skills, DUI Education and Cognitive-behavioral interventions.
 - iii. Provide intervention strategies with mental health and substance abuse services.
 - iv. Assist with Job search and employment services.
 - v. Assist participants with housing referrals, employment placement, transportation, food, clothing and other necessities.
 - vi. Offer all services in English and Spanish and accommodate for other languages and differences in abilities.
2. Performance bench marks.
 - a. Provide services, resources and/or supportive relationships for up to 500 justice involved individuals during 2018.
 - b. Maintain a caseload of no less than 35 cases and no more than 60 cases per case manager and/or direct staff.
 - c. 60% of participants will complete one or more of the following of the TJC program aspects to include:
 - i. Completion of groups.

- ii. Obtaining employment and maintaining employment for 180 days.
- iii. Obtaining benefits.
- iv. Obtaining stable housing.
- v. Successful completion of obligation to the justice system.

Cost/value: \$550,000.00 for new award amount. Total amount for contract will be \$550,000.

Source of funds: Crime Prevention and Control Commission (CPCC)

Benefit: The TJC program utilizes best practice methods to: reduce recidivism or likelihood of a person returning to jail by improving stabilization upon returning to the community; and improve the quality of life for persons involved in the criminal justice system.
