Length of services are based on the family's needs. PSSF prevention program services are provided through the DCP per a memorandum of understanding with the State of Colorado which defines goals, resources, and services or programs to be provided by the Denver Collaborative Management Program known as DCP. ## Was this contractor selected by competitive process? No

If not, why not? DCP is Denver's Collaborative Management Program and are required to have a fiscal agent per the HB1451 legislation. The fiscal agent is required to inform and be held accountable by DCP's interagency Oversight Group (IOG). Since the program is funded by state funds, Colorado Department of Human Services (CDHS) requires the funds to pass through the local human services agency, which requires a city contract per City rules. However, the IOG is responsible for monitoring the fiscal agent and holding them responsible to their fiscal responsibilities to the program and to the IOG. The IOG directs the terms of the State MOU which has an agreement term that follows the State Fiscal Year (July 1 to June 30) annually.

The PSSF contract for prevention services is a federal program grant that is provided on the federal fiscal year term, which explains the term difference for this contract.
