In December 2022, Denver began experiencing a significant influx in the number of newly arriving immigrants and asylum seekers. To avoid a humanitarian crisis, the City and County of Denver (City) activated several emergency shelters and services. Throughout 2023 and into 2024, Denver has experienced a continued and fluctuating flow of new arrivals. Some of these new arrivals desire to move onward to other destinations, while others wish to stay in Denver as newcomers to the City. Since December 2022, the City and County of Denver has welcomed over 40,000 newcomers to the United States.

Recognizing the benefits of case management in integrating newcomers into the Denver community or supporting them as they pursue opportunities elsewhere, the City has identified a contractor through a competetive solicitation process to administer enrollment in the DASP and manage communications with newcomers seeking enrollment and participating in the program, as well as providing food and personal items assistance to newcomers, citywide.

Scope of work:

Haven of Hope shall administer enrollment in the DASP and communication with newcomers. This includes identifying eligible newcomers, creating an enrollment process, managing a waitlist, tracking and managing DASP enrollment data, collaborating with other DASP service administrators to connect newcomers with rental, food and personal items assistance.

Haven of Hope shall also provide food and personal item assistance including the provision of food or cash assistance in regular intervals to DASP enrollees, develop guidelines for usage of cash assistance for food and personal items, and assist newcomers with strategies for developing food security over time. Additionally, DASP participants and newcomers on the waitlist may access other Haven of Hope resources on site as planned for and contemplated in the scope of work, further connecting newcomers to resources and community organizations which may help them achieve their goals and settle in to Denver as new residents.
