This ordinance will approve a third (3rd) amendment to the On-Call annual professional services agreement with PBS&J, for 1 year with option of a yearly renewal for one (1) more year. Maximum amount per year not to exceed \$500,000, with total not to exceed \$2,500,000. All work will be accomplished on a Task Order basis. The City will identify and define projects and funding as the need arises and the Consultant will provide a scope of work, schedule, cost estimate, and deliverables. Work will proceed only after the submittal is approved and a Notice to Proceed is issued.

The work will be primarily for any of the following engineering tasks: Full Range of Civil Design Services, including, Hydraulic studies and design, Street and pavement design, Utility design (including permitting), Land Surveying, Traffic Engineering, Geotechnical Engineering, Materials testing, Environmental and hazardous materials work, Electrical and Lighting Engineering, and Plan Review Assistance.

Background: On-Call General Engineering Services:

The Public Works Department, during its normal course of business, does not have the required staff and other resources on hand to perform all the studies, designs, inspections and other engineering tasks that become necessary. For those instances when a situation or event requires some type of engineering service and there is a short time frame to solve or design a solution for the situation or event, it is necessary to use a consultant to provided these services.

Due to the time frame, it is not feasible to go through a normal process of issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP) and executing a contract for each situation or event. Therefore it is necessary to use a consultant that is already under contract. In order to obtain consultants with the required expertise and team composition and have them under contract, Public Works issued a RFP June 4, 2007 requesting firms submit a proposal outlining their expertise and team organization. Twenty One (21) firms responded. Additionally, in order to assure flexibility to the City and be able to have a consultant, with the required expertise and personnel, available on little notice, to begin the design process, the Engineering Division determined that multiple consultant teams would be necessary to comply with the City’s obligations for the federal funds. Eight (8) teams were selected through the interview process

The selected firms furnish experienced engineering personnel or supply the necessary services to supplement the City’s Project Management forces. In this respect, the Consultant agrees to maintain on its payroll, or have access to outside subconsultants at all times during the term of the agreement, engineers and technicians in sufficient strength to

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meet the requirements of the City. The selected firm or consortium must possess some or all of the following capabilities, or be able to provide the remainder of the services, depending on the project needs: general civil engineering and traffic engineering services, geotechnical engineering, materials testing, structural and bridge design services, environmental and hazardous materials work, electrical and lighting engineering and land surveying.

This On-Call General Engineering Services Agreement will allow the Engineering Division the flexibility to provide engineering designs for anticipated projects on a timely basis. The design services encompass a wide range of Civil Engineering Disciplines allow for possible use on the multitude of projects that are generated in the normal course of business in Public Works.

There are no funds encumbered under the Master Contract until a consultant is issued a Task Order by the City identifying the scope, the fee, the schedule and the deliverables.

PBSJ has proposed the participation of 11 subconsultants: The Abo Group, All Traffic Data, Applied Design Services, ArtLand Land Use & Economics, Clanton, CRL & Assoc., Industrial Distribution & Engineering Services, Inc., Ordonez & Vogelsgang, Inc, Pinyon Environmental, Inc., Woolpert, Inc., and Yeh & Assoc.

All Traffic Data, Inc., Clanton & Associates, Navjoy Consulting, Hartwig, Inc., Ordonez & Vogelsgang, Inc., Pinyon Environmental, Inc., and Yeh & Assoc. are MBE/WBE firms. PBSJ has committed to the 10% MBE/WBE goals.

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
