
# MISSION STATEMENT

# DAV'S STRUCTURE – PAST & PRESENT

**2003:** Mayor's Office of Art, Culture and Film becomes Denver Office of Cultural Affairs (DOCA)

**2011:** DOCA (General Fund-supported) merges with the city's Division of Theatres and Arenas (Special Revenue Fund) and becomes Arts & Venues to leverage efficiencies and create cost savings to the General Fund


**2025:** Office of Special Events merges with Denver Arts & Venues to leverage efficiencies and create cost savings to the General Fund

## **Denver Arts & Venues Social-Cultural Enterprise Model**

- Net revenue is primarily generated through Red Rocks Amphitheatre, Buell Theatre and venue sponsorships
- This revenue is then used to support general operating costs, venue operations, cultural programming and 1% for Public Art operations
- Remaining capacity is used to maintain DAV's venues\* along with FDA revenue (Seat Tax)
- Loretto Heights Theatre will be the first new venue added to DAV portfolio in over 10 years

# DAV'S SOCIAL-CULTURAL ENTERPRISE MODEL

## 2024 Net Revenue



- **\$45M** = projected annual average cost to maintain level of service at venues

- **\$2.5-\$5M** = projected net annual investment required to operate Loretto Heights Theatre



# MAJOR CULTURAL INITIATIVES

Denver Arts & Venues developed, and stewards **DENVER CREATES: A Collective Commitment to the Arts**, the city's roadmap for a thriving arts and culture ecosystem. Grounded in research and driven by community voices, this roadmap outlines three key commitments: broadening access, cultivating the cultural community, and supporting the economic vitality of Denver's creative sector.

## LORETTO HEIGHTS THEATRE RENOVATION

A \$60M full renovation of the Loretto Heights Theatre is currently underway and will open as a new community hub in Southwest Denver in 2027/2028.

## Five Points Jazz Grants



**Five Points Jazz grants** provide support for local, year-round programming that honors the history of jazz in Denver's historic Five Points neighborhood

## DENVER CREATES Fund



The **DENVER CREATES** Fund focus is to broadening access to arts and culture, cultivate the cultural community, and support the vitality of Denver's cultural sector.

## Arts in Society



**Arts in Society** is a grant-making program administered by Redline supporting the integration of arts and culture into multiple disciplines critical to the health and well-being of Coloradans.

## P.S. You Are Here



**P.S. You Are Here** funds community-led outdoor projects in Denver's public spaces aimed to transform underutilized neighborhood elements to honor heritage and enrich communities.

## Arts Complex Creates



**Arts Complex Creates** aims to expand and diversify the cultural offerings and attract broader audiences at the Denver Performing Arts complex through partnerships with Denver's creative community.

## Art Drop Day Denver

Art Drop Day is an annual global event held on the first Tuesday in September, creating bonds between strangers through the act of creating and giving. DAV hosts Denver's celebration through social media, encouraging artists to drop art across the city for others to find.

## Public Art Tours

Curated public art tours hosted by docents and DAV staff help guide residents and visitors through Denver's Public Art Collection. With more than 400 pieces in the collection, people can find a diverse assortment of tours that fit their interests – virtual, on foot or bike.

## 16<sup>th</sup> Street Performer's Network

The 16<sup>th</sup> Street Performers Network activates downtown Denver with live music, art, and entertainment. A partnership between DAV and Downtown Denver Partnership, the program connects local performers with businesses, creating an arts-driven experience.

# RED ROCKS REVENUE & EXPENSES

# How a Rental Works

For each show there is a booking agreement requiring the tenant to comply with certain terms. They pay rent and generally cover all the expenses for production and staffing.

## Revenue Sources

Rent, FDA tax (Seat tax), Facility Fee (parking), food and beverage sales, show and non-show retail (merchandise), sponsorship, ticketing fees, equipment rentals, labor and other reimbursements (Piece of the Rock, Town of Morrison, etc.).

# Non-reimbursed Expenses

Traffic control (covered by facility fee), janitorial (covered in rent unless extraordinary cleanup i.e. confetti), general overhead, food and beverage labor (covered by sales).










