General description/background of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable: In November 2008, the City executed a Lease Purchase Agreement (Lease) under which the Trustee entered into a certificates of participation (COPs) transaction for proceeds used at the Denver Botanic Gardens to provide funding for the construction of the parking garage at the Denver Botanic Gardens at York Street. The City can reduce the Lease interest costs by amending the Lease and permitting the refinancing of the Series 2008B COPs at a lower interest rate. The refunding will not raise additional proceeds or extend the original repayment term, and is expected to generate about 13.1% (approximately \$2.1 million) of interest cost savings for the Denver Botanic Gardens. The parking structure at the Denver Botanic Gardens will continue to serve as collateral and annual lease payments are expected to be continued to be paid in full by revenues of the Denver Botanic Gardens.

Executive Summary

Ordinance to Authorize an Advance Refunding Certificate of Participation, Series 2008B Lease Purchase Transaction

The proposed ordinance authorizes the Manager of Finance to amend its Lease Purchase and permit the Trustee to undertake an advance refunding certificate of participation (COPs) transaction (the "Series 2017A COPs) to provide savings for the Denver Botanic Gardens, and to advance refund all of the outstanding Series 2008B COPs which provided funding for the construction of the parking garage at the Denver Botanic Gardens at York Street. The principal amount of the refunding transaction will not exceed \$17.6 million and is expected to generate 13.1% (approximately \$2.1 million) of interest cost savings for the Denver Botanic Gardens. The average interest rate on the outstanding Series 2008B COPs is 5.25%. The 2017A COPs will bear a fixed interest rate not to exceed 2.5% and will be callable at any time without prepayment penalties. The Series 2017A COPs will be sold in a private placement transaction to UMB Financial Corporation, which was selected through a competitive bid process. The refunding transaction will not raise additional proceeds or extend the original final maturity date of December 1, 2028, of the Series 2008B COPs.

The structure of the refunding transaction consists of an annually renewable Lease/Purchase agreement between the Denver Botanic Gardens Parking Facility Leasing Trust 2017 ("Trust") and the City and County of Denver. The Trust will execute and deliver Series 2017A Refunding COPs in an amount sufficient to defease the Series 2008B COPs. The Series 2008B COPs are callable on December 1, 2018, and proceeds from the Series 2017A transaction will be used to pay off the Series 2008B COPs on that date. This advance refunding structure is similar to a number of transactions completed by the City over the years to reduce costs of financing capital improvements.

The parking structure at the Denver Botanic Gardens will continue to serve as collateral on the refunded COPs. As agreed under a Cooperative Agreement between the City and County of Denver and the Denver Botanic Gardens, the Denver Botanic Gardens currently pays the annual lease payments under the Series 2008B COPs and revenues of the Denver Botanic Gardens are expected to continue to pay the new annual lease payments in full. No General Fund moneys have been used to pay the lease payments on the outstanding Series 2008B COPs and this is expected to remain the same on the proposed Series 2017A Refunding COPs.

The Lease payments used to pay the Series 2017A Refunding COPs will be subject to annual appropriation by the City Council and neither the Lease nor the COPs constitute a multiple year fiscal obligation of the City. On an annual basis, the City may elect to terminate the lease by not appropriating funds to make the lease payments. If that occurs, the Trust can take possession of the lease of the facility for the benefit of the Certificate holders.

Costs associated with the transaction will be paid from the proceeds of the refunding.
