This program provides households with safe, private, and clean non-congregate shelter space, while also offering intensive case management and wraparound support services. Households will have access to housing navigation, financial and money management guidance, education and employment support, programming for children, and mental health referrals and support services, as needed. Services are delivered utilizing trauma-informed care, harm reduction, and Housing First strategies to support long-term housing stability.

This amendment adds 20 additional family shelter units at The Crossing, bringing the total program capacity to 30 units serving families experiencing literal homelessness. The additional units are being brought online to support increased family shelter needs and to absorb households currently residing at the Lambuth Family Shelter, which is to close temporarily for renovations.

Scope of work:

The Denver Rescue Mission will provide housing-focused case management and wraparound support services to families experiencing literal homelessness through The Crossing Program, a non-congregate family shelter program. Families entering the program will be provided with private shelter accommodations, including private rooms and bathrooms, clean linens, access to laundry facilities, and three meals per day in a safe and stable environment.

Supportive services will include crisis intervention and conflict resolution, benefit acquisition and connection to mainstream resources, individualized case planning, needs assessments, assistance obtaining vital documents, case conferencing, housing navigation, transportation assistance, and access to on-site mental health support and referrals, as needed.

Case management services will focus on assisting households with obtaining permanent housing and providing the wraparound support necessary to promote long-term housing stability and success.
