Denver has a contract with Qwest for the upgrade of the city network. This is being paid through a finance agreement with five milestone payments. Qwest recently informed the city that there are changes to the availability of the equipment listed in the project, due to the amount of time between when the bill of materials was created and when the contract was signed.

In some cases equipment is being discontinued and replaced with new models. In other cases, the manufacturer has changed the way that they sell software licenses.

The cost of the overall project will remain the same. Each of the five milestone payments on the contract will also remain the same. The only changes will be to model numbers or in some cases, quantities.

The request is to amend the Network Upgrade contract with the updated bill of materials.

The amendment is to update the equipment listed on the bill of materials under the contract. We put the list of equipment together over a year ago and during that time models numbers (and in some cases, the models themselves) have changed. For example, we had originally listed 14 routers, model 3845. That router has now changed to a model 3945. The price is exactly the same.
