11	Section 1. That Division 5, Article VIII, Section 2, D.R.M.C., is hereby repealed in its entirety					
12	and the section is amended by re-enacting a new Division 5 to read as follows:

14	DIVISION 5 CITY-SCHOOL COORDINATING COMMITTEE

16	Sec. 2-229 Legislative intent.					
17	The council hereby declares the legislative intent of this division is to achieve the most effective					
18	possible coordination and utilization of all resources of the city and the school district that may serve					
19	the recreational, educational, cultural, and social needs of the people of the city. In addition to the					
20	requirements outlined in this section, the city-school coordinating committee meetings may require					
21	assistance from other public agencies and higher educational institutions, as well as private					
22	organizatior	ns and agencies, concerned with th	e educational, recreational, social, and cultural needs of			
23	the people of the city.

25	Sec. 2-230 Establishment and membership.					
26	There is he	reby created a city-school coordi	nating committee which shall consist of the following			
27	members:					
28	(a)	The mayor, or their designee;				
29	(b)	Two (2) members of city council	, appointed by the president of council;			
30	(c)	The director of the office of child	Iren affairs or their designee;			
31	(d)	Two (2) members of the board of	education, nominated by the president of the board and			
32	approved by the board of education; and					
33	(e)	The superintendent of schools,	or an individual from public schools administration,			
34	nominated b	by the superintendent of schools a	nd approved by the board of education.			
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2 Sec. 2-231. - Term of committee members.

3 The members of the city-school coordinating committee shall serve for a period of two (2) (a) 4 years.

(b) Committee members may be reappointed for successive terms.

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Sec. 2-232. - Vacancies. 7

8 Any vacancy which occurs on the city-school coordinating committee shall be filled in (a) 9 accordance with the provisions of section 2-230 within thirty (30) days of the vacancy; and the new 10 member so appointed to the committee shall serve the unexpired term of the person so replaced.

11 (b) If a vacancy is not filled within thirty (30) days, City Council may appoint a member to serve the unexpired term. 12

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14 Sec. 2-233. - Officers.

The city-school coordinating committee shall elect from its membership, a chairperson and such 15 16 other officers as it may designate who shall serve for such term or terms as the committee shall 17 specify in their bylaws.

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19 Sec. 2-234. - Meetings.

The schedule of regular meetings of the city-school coordinating committee shall be 20 (a) 21 established by a majority of the membership, but the commission must meet no less frequently than bi-22 monthly.

> Additional meetings shall be called as needed by the chairperson of the committee. (b)

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Sec. 2-235. - Powers and duties. 25

26 The powers and duties of the city-school coordinating committee shall be as follows:

27 (a) To undertake, on a continuing basis, the study of all possibilities for cooperation between 28 the city and the school district in the development, maintenance, and use of facilities authorized to 29 each of them, and to make recommendations for carrying out such joint endeavors as may be feasible;

30 To review and be aware of all facilities and programs of the city and the school district that (b) 31 serve the recreational, educational, social, and cultural needs of the people of the city in order to make 32 recommendations designed to avoid duplication of expenses and efforts and to provide facilities which 33 can be used by the greatest number of people possible during the maximum periods of time possible; 34 (c) To formulate and make recommendations to the mayor, council, superintendent, and

1	board of education and appropriate public or private agencies; such recommendations may include				
2	needed policies, changes in present operations, practices or procedures, including safety policies and				
3	procedures, and proposals for funding consideration and legislative action which are designed to serve				
4	the recreational, educational, cultural, and social needs of the people of the city;				
5	(d) To develop joint proposals for federal, state, local, and private funds that may be available				
6	for joint city-school district programs and activities;				
7	(e) To study alternative financing mechanisms that may be available for the purposes of joint				
8	city-school district programs and activities;				
9	(f) To establish a list of priority joint city-school district improvements that shall be transmitted				
10	to the mayor, city council, and board of education.
