



DESIGN AND DEMOLITION REVIEW:

- Properties designated "as is" no improvement requirements
- Required for exterior changes tied to perm ONLY
 - Objective design review process
 - Not frozen in time
 - No review of work on interiors or paint colors
- Demolitions discouraged

- Plymouth Congregational Chu
 - Constructed southern half in 189
 - Completed northern half in 1899
- First Unitarian Society of Denv
 - Since 1871, occupied multiple buildings
 - Owned first building in 1873
 - Second in 1886
 - Moved to 1400 Lafayette in 1958
 - Major fire in 1985
 - Damage to sanctuary






