- 5. Describe the proposed ordinance, including what the proposed ordinance is intended to accomplish, who's involved
  - a. Scope of Work

The funding for this ordinance comes from forestry general fund annual operating budget and is reimbursed by home owners. The expenses are related to enforcement of public safety related code violations or emergency storm response for debris blocking public rights-of-way. The final expenses associated with the use of this contract are billed to property owners. Property owners who choose voluntary enforcement that cannot afford to remove dead trees within their own means can take advantage of a 12month no interest payment plan offered by the P&R Department. Since 2011 the Parks and Recreation Department has had an average return of 80% cost recovery (recovered funds paid by property owners which return to general fund). ACME Tree Service is the low-bid contractor for the on-call tree services contract. When next contractors inline through this awarded contract are used, increased expenses to Denver property owners are incurred. ACME Tree Service has been the only contractor that consistently responds to after hour requests from Public Works Safety when there is a need to mitigate storm damage or major roadways being obstructed from late night tree failures. By increasing the spending limit and term of the contract the City is minimizing the potential expenses paid by property owners for emergency tree removals and /or enforcement of code violations. ACME Tree Service has been of major benefit to Police, Fire, Public Works, Parks & Recreation / Forestry, and Denver property owners as the low-bid on-call contractor offering high quality public safety related tree care services at a bid price lower than any other licensed tree service.
