Department of Parks & Recreation Division of Planning, Design & Construction (PDC)

PDC is seeking to extend the end date on a group of qualified On-Call contractors available to respond to proposal bidding requests for the execution of restoration, natural resource management, lake management and other technical services for the City.

Purpose and Use of Agreements:

The purpose of these On-Call contracts is to establish and maintain a pool of qualified On-Call Restoration Service Contractors. They will be available to respond to bidding requests for the execution of PDC's and the Urban Ecology and Open Space Program's work plans. These contracts will be utilized for natural resource management, lake management, native landscape management, ecological restoration, assessments and mapping, and other technical services. The variety of work is typically done in City parks, other city-owned land and land managed by Denver Parks and Recreation.

Procurement:

Ten (10) firms were selected based on qualified submittals and scoring.

Contracts Amendment #2:

The amendment will extend the end date of all ten (10) existing contracts by one (1) year from 5/30/2025 to 5/31/2026. Each contract had an original three (3) year term, with a one (1) year extension option. The firms selected for these agreements are listed alphabetically.
