\*This district has a reduced assessment that equals \$37,689 for 2013 since there are sufficient reserves held by the district to cover a portion of the proposed 2013 budget. The assessment has not changed from 2012 to 2013.

\*\*The 2013 budget increase is due to an increase in maintenance and snow removal costs, the repair and potential replacement of pedestrian lights and the replacement of a tree grate.
