Youth Violence Prevention Council Elevating Youth Voice



- Youth Involvement has been a central element in creating our public health strategy.
- Our Youth Violence Prevention
 Council consists of young
 people ranging 15-20 of age. All
 have lived experiences with
 youth violence and come from
 Denver communities most
 impacted by youth violence.
- These advisors provide our exec committee advice and recommendations and are paid for their expertise.
- The council currently has 7
 members: 3 males, 4 females; 3
 Black/African-American, 4
 Latinx



COVID-19 & Youth Violence Prevention Short-Term Strategy

- Workshop: Tackling Two Public Health Crises at Once
- 4 work groups were created in 6 policy areas:

Youth
Engagement
& Messaging

Juvenile Justice Community Involvement & Outreach

Race & Social Equity

Data Sharing

Mental Health Services

26 Action items were created and completed throughout the fall.





COVID-19 & Youth Violence Prevention Long-Term Strategy

- Denver's plan includes 22 long-term strategies consistent with the public health approach endorsed by CDC and The Prevention Institute
- Prepared in conjunction with needs assessment by CU Denver
- Through the 2021 budget process we secured an additional \$500k in specific YVP funding on top of \$71 Million in youth services.



Center for Disease Control (CDC) - YVP Strategic Framework

- Recognizes youth violence is an interaction of multiple factors
 - Risk and Protective
- Requires a comprehensive approach
- Youth violence is preventable



Promote family environments that support healthy development

- · Early childhood home visitation
- · Parenting skill and family relationship programs



Provide quality education early in life

· Preschool enrichment with family engagement



Strengthen youth's skills

· Universal school-based programs



Connect youth to caring adults and activities

- · Mentoring programs
- · After-school programs



Create protective community environments

- · Modify the physical and social environment
- · Reduce exposure to community-level risks
- · Street outreach and community norm change



Intervene to lessen harms and prevent future risk

- · Treatment to lessen the harms of violence exposures
- · Treatment to prevent problem behavior and further involvement in violence
- · Hospital-community partnerships





Promote Healthy Family Environments

- Increase access to family and parent programs
 - StrengtheningFamilies/Familias FuertesPrograms
 - Strong African American
 Family Program



Intervene to lessen harms and prevent future risk

- Early identification and response for youth at-risk
 - Screening and support
 - Regional Multi-Disciplinary
 Teams
- Data sharing agreement with Denver Public Health
 - Cardiff Model





Creating Protective Community Environments

- Youth Centers
 - Managed by community collective.
 - Community identified services
 - ✓ Building Purchased (CDBG)
 - ✓ 2021 Operational Budget Approved

Creating Protective Community Environments

- Safe Zone Program
 - o Piloted in 2020
 - o RFP to fund multiple sites
 - Activities and connection to others
 - √ 2021 Budget Approved

Creating Protective Community Environments

- Promote Safe Storage
 - Lock Out Public AwarenessCampaign
 - Collaboration with Mayor'sYouth Commission
 - Gun Lock giveaway program





Connecting Youth to Caring Adults & Activities

- City Employee Mentoring Program
 - City employees granted
 leave to mentor youth
 - Individual or group
 - Pittsburgh & Louisville examples

Connecting Youth to Caring Adults & Activities

- City Corps Program
 - Hire 18-24 year old
 - Serve as peer navigators to support youth.
 - Connection to Youth Centers

Connecting Youth to Caring Adults & Activities

- YVP Micro Grants
 - Partnership with DPS
 - \$125,000 available in 2020
 - o 62 applicants 17 funded
 - √ 2021 Budget Approved



YVP Support Strategies

- Youth Violence Prevention is a public health crisis that requires a comprehensive set of strategies that can address multiple risk factors
- To realize tangible benefits of these strategies, the work must be supported on multiple levels







Creating Support Infrastructure

- Work must be rooted in an agency to support long-term sustainability
- Identify lead city agency (OCA)
- Maintain Action Table to support work

YVP Program Coordinator

- Coordinate implementation
 of YVP strategies with
 support from Action Table
- Housed in OCA
- Liaison to community

Higher Education Partnership

- CU Boulder CSPV
 - Database of evidenced-based program (Blueprints)
 - Communities that Care
- Community College of Denver
 - Academic and career support



Support Strategies – Alignment of Services & Strategies

Align existing YVP efforts

- Analysis of existing YVP efforts (city and community)
- Maximize existing resources and combine duplicative efforts
- Expand or enhance effective strategies/programs

Denver/Aurora Regional YVP Compact

- Compact to work
 collaboratively to address
 youth violence
- Common strategies such as Safe Zone Events
- Expand to other municipalities

Alignment of city-led youth services

- Expand use of Youth Program
 Locator
- Roadmap to align youth services
 - Public Safety Youth Programs
 - Other youth violence prevention programs





DDPHE support of YVP strategies

- Utilizing a public health approach to address youth violence.
- DDPHE to include YVP work within agency staff duties

Parks and Recreation support of YVP strategies

- CPTED Report
- Night Moves & Safe Zone events support
- Programming space for YVPrelated services

Expand supports Juvenile Justice involved youth

- Work with juvenile justice system to:
 - Prevent involvement
 - Reduce recidivism
- 2nd Judicial District Juvenile Services Planning Committee
