BOARD PURPOSE

The Broadway Denver General Improvement District (GID) is a public entity dedicated to enhancing and maintaining the Broadway corridor (from 6th Avenue to I-25) through services and improvements that support a vibrant, safe, and economically strong district. Governed by a volunteer board of property owners, business stakeholders, and community representatives, the board provides oversight and strategic direction for district initiatives including cleaning, safety, public realm improvements, marketing, events, and business advocacy.

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BOARD COMPOSITION REQUIREMENTS

The board shall consist of 11 members – nine of whom are appointed and confirmed and two of whom are designated within the ordinance:

- The Manager of Finance, or the Manager of Finance's designated representative.
- The Council District member whose district overlaps a majority of the total acreage of the District, or the Council District member's designated representative.

For the Mayor-appointed members, following the initial terms, which initial terms shall not count toward the term limit, the length of the term is four (4) years and the consecutive term limit shall be two (2) terms; after a member has fulfilled two consecutive terms, that person may not be a member of the District Advisory Board for at least two (2) years before being reappointed. District Advisory Board members shall continue to serve until the later to occur of the expiration of their City & County of Denver terms below or until a successor is appointed and confirmed by Council.

Subject to appointment, reasonable efforts will be made to include a mix of the following characteristics:

- At least one (1) representative from an owner of commercial property in the District boundaries;
- At least one (1) representative from a retail business owner in the District boundaries;
- At least one (1) representative from a restaurant/bar business owner in the District boundaries
- At least one (1) representative from an owner of residential property in the District boundaries;
- At least one (1) resident living in the District boundaries.
