However, I have kept in touch with her and followed her academic career as a Graduate student at Colorado Christian University, and at the Iliff School of Theology. I point out that she received Summa Cum Laude at both institutions. She is now a Doctoral student in Educational Leadership for Equity in Higher Education at the University of Colorado Denver, with an excellent academic record. She expects to complete her dissertation for her Doctorate in 2013.

Ms. Jaramillo's academic training corresponds exceedingly well with the "purpose of the commission," as your "Latino Commission" website states. For example, the first purpose highlighted is, "Respond to state or local legislative issues impacting the Latino community." Her B.A. in Chicana/o Studies is almost ready-made to achieve such a purpose, as our curriculum emphasizes issues of concern to the Latino community. Her M.A. from Colorado Christian University in Curriculum Design. Instruction, and Educational Leadership emphasizes the educational needs of the Latino community, as education is in my estimation the single most significant issue impacting the Latino community. Since 2019 she has been an Affiliate Faculty member at MSU Denver in her home Department of Chicana/o Studies especially as a Concurrent Enrollment faculty. And at the University of Colorado Denver, she has served as a Graduate Assistant, Teaching Assistant, and Lecturer, including for upper-division courses. A review of the classes she has taught shows her continual commitment to serving the needs of all students, with an additional focus on Latina/o students as well as African Americans and other marginalized students. For example, at UCD she has served as a TA for HDFR 3020 Black and Latino Children in Families and Schools and as a Lecturer for HDFR 4260 Family Systems and Social Justice.

In addition to her excellent records as student and instructor, she has a remarkable record of accomplishment already in such areas as educational and community service, membership on boards and commissions including the Colorado State Adult Education Service and the Colorado Department of Higher Education, and among other examples, extensive leadership in education, especially for Chicana/o and other racial and ethnic minority communities. As but one major example among others, at UCD she is the President of the Doctoral Students of Color, and she has put into place methods and practices to recruit students of color and retain and graduate them through a variety of creative and innovative ways.

For the nearly twenty years I have known her and followed her exceptional progress, Ms. Jaramillo has consistently worked for the betterment of others, a path to which she appears to have been born to. She would excel as a member of the Denver Latino Commission in the Mayor's Office, and you would be lucky to have her on the Commission. Thank you for considering my recommendation, and please let me know if I can provide any additional information on her behalf.
