The Sheriff Department will allow West Metro Fire to pick up available vehicles marked for recycling (from the Vehicle Impound Facility) for training purposes. Upon completion of training exercises, West Metro Fire will transport the vehicle to the recycling center. Any revenue generated from the recycling will be credited to the City.

The Denver Fire Department needs will be met first.
