### WHO WE ARE

DAV is the city's arts and culture agency. We are responsible for operating some of the region's most renowned facilities, including Red Rocks Amphitheatre, Denver Performing Arts Complex, Colorado Convention Center and more, and oversee the Denver Public Art Collection.

Funds generated by the agency are put back into the community through grants for artists and arts organizations, free or low-cost community cultural events like Five Points Jazz Festival, art in public spaces, venue maintenance and improvement and arts education.

Every good time at one of our venues enriches Denver through arts and culture and helps Denver's cultural community thrive – for good!



#### DYNAMIC DOWNTOWN DENVER GRANT


- Funded by DAV and administered by Downtown Denver Partnership.

- Open March 1 August 1




## DAV ARTS & CULTURE FUND

- Applications open late March 2024






## P.S. YOU ARE HERE

P.S. You Are Here (PSYAH) supports neighborhood- based, community-led projects in outdoor public spaces.

These temporary projects integrate the arts, build civic engagement, honor heritage, beautify neighborhoods and enrich communities.

Since 2014, we've provided more than \$600K to support 71 projects across Denver.

- \$70,000 in funding is allocated for 2024
- Applications open in early September 2024



### **URBAN ARTS FUND: ENGAGE**





Offshoot of Urban Arts Fund mural program that focuses more intentionally on art for community building, healing, cultural awareness and positive social change. Connecting artists together with the communities that will be experiencing the murals in their daily lives.

**ARTS IN SOCIETY** 

Collaborative grant-making program supporting the integration of arts and culture into multiple disciplines critical to the health and well-being of Coloradans.

Administered by RedLine and funded by a cohort of Colorado foundations

- Grants up to \$35,000



#### **EQUITY IN ARTS LEARNING**

- Increase access to arts education for historically marginalized youth
- Grants of \$10,000-\$25,000
- Youth 4-21
- Support for projects that bring professional artists and culture bearers into educational settings





# DENVER PUBLIC ART

More than 440 pieces of art can be found in all corners of the city with 80+ projects in progress and budgets totaling more than \$25.3M.

Over \$45M invested in the collection, along with historic and donated works of art, providing opportunity for Denver residents to experience art in public places.

All year long, DAV presents free and low-cost programming for residents and visitors to enjoy, elevating the cultural experience, not only inside our venues, but throughout the community.


# FIVE POINTS JAZZ FESTIVAL

- Public Survey Data captures residents' sentiments about arts and culture in Denver – 2024, Comparison from 2013, 2017, 2020 and 2024










**Economic Activity Study of Metro Denver Culture**






