**A BILL**

**For an ordinance amending the classification and pay plan for employees in the Career Service and for certain employees not in the Career Service.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to section 9.1.1 (C) and (D) of the Charter and Article I of Chapter 18, D.R.M.C., the Office of Human Resources has recommended to the City Council an amendment to the classification and pay plan governing the compensation of employees in the career service and certain employees not in the career service;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** That effective beginning of the first work week following approval by the Mayor or by the City Council over the Mayor's veto, the classification and pay plan is hereby amended by revising the classification specification and changing the pay grade of the following classification:

**Current Classification Title**  
Business License Inspector

**Current Pay Grade**  
N-615 (\$18.89-\$23.24-\$27.58)

**Proposed Pay Grade**  
N-617 (\$20.65-\$25.40-\$30.15)

**Section 2.** That the foregoing amendments shall be reflected in the full classification and pay plan kept and maintained in the office of the Clerk and Recorder, as reflected at Clerk Filing No. 17-0206-I, and at the Office of Human Resources, and shall be available for public inspection both in person and on-line.
