A BILL

For an ordinance relinquishing easements, in their entirety, reserved in Ordinance No. 50, Series of 1954, recorded with the Denver Clerk & Recorder at Book 7454, Page 139; Ordinance No. 253, Series of 1956, recorded with the Denver Clerk & Recorder at Book 7902, Page 153; and Ordinance No. 728, Series of 1978, recorded with the Denver Clerk & Recorder at Book 1825, Page 610, located at 263 North Josephine Street.

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure of the City and County of Denver has found and determined that the public use, convenience and necessity no longer requires the easements in the above-referenced Ordinances, and subject to approval by ordinance, has relinquished the same;
