## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of the resolution is to set a combined public hearing on the Service Plans for the formation and establishment of two (2) Title 32 metropolitan districts: West Globeville Metropolitan Districts No. 1 and No.2.

The boundaries of the two districts will eventually encompass roughly 41 acres located at the southwest corner of I-70 and I-25 interstates. The project site is the former Denver Post printing facility. The proposed Service Area of the districts are generally east of the Southern Pacific railroad tracks, north of 43<sup>rd</sup> Ave., south of I-70, and west Fox St and 45<sup>th</sup> Ave.

Per the typical City Council process, this topic will be sent through the City Council process twice. The first part is to act on a resolution setting August 31<sup>st</sup> as the date of a public hearing at City Council. The second part will be to act on an ordinance approving the proposed Service Plans after the public hearing. City staff is requesting to put the resolution on consent and make a committee single presentation once the ordinance is submitted.

State law requires that a public hearing be conducted prior to City Council approving a service plan, with publication to commence a minimum of 20 days prior to the hearing. Attached is a proposed schedule for both legislative processes to comply with State Statutes. The schedule assumes a presentation to Finance and Services Committee on August 11<sup>th</sup> and a public hearing at City Council on August 31<sup>st</sup>. It will be important to be complete with the City Council process by the end of August to allow enough time for the deadlines associated with a November 2015 election.

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
