

**SECOND AMENDMENT TO  
INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**

**THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT**, dated as hereinafter set forth, is made by and between the **CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER**, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado (hereinafter referred to as the “City” or the “Police Department”) and **SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1 IN THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER AND STATE OF COLORADO** (hereafter referred to as “DPS”, the “School District” or the “District”) (collectively as “Parties”).

The Parties entered into an Agreement dated November 20, 2017 (the “Agreement”) and into an Amendatory Agreement dated April 12, 2019 to provide the services described in the Scope of Work.

The Parties agree as follows:

1. The Budget marked as Exhibit B-1 is attached hereto and incorporated into the Agreement by this reference.

2. Article 6. a. of the Agreement, entitled “REIMBURSEMENT BY SCHOOL DISTRICT”, “School District’s Cost of SRO Partnership/Invoicing and Payments” is amended to read as follows:

“6. REIMBURSEMENT BY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

a. School District’s Cost of SRO Partnership/Invoicing and Payments. Except as provided herein, from September 20, 2017 through June 6, 2022, DPS agrees to pay, and the City agrees to accept, as full and complete compensation to the City for SRO Partnership, a fixed cost of **Two Million Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars and Ninety-Seven Cents (\$2,013,785.97)** payable on a pro-rated monthly basis during the term hereof. Invoices for DPS’s portion of the cost sharing arrangement are due and payable in full upon receipt.”

3. Except as herein amended, the Agreement is affirmed and ratified in each and every particular.

4. This Second Amendment to Intergovernmental Agreement will not be effective or binding on the City until it has been fully executed by all required signatories of the City and County of Denver, and if required by Charter, approved by the City Council.

**NON-STUDENT CONTACT DAYS**

- 1 Planning, assessment and professional days (no classes for students; 11.5 days total)  
Aug. 9, 12-16; Oct. 21, 22; Jan. 6; Feb. 14; April 6; May 29 (half day).
- 3 Centrality offered professional learning days: Aug. 13; Oct 21; Feb. 14.

Non-student contact days breakdown: Minimum of five days for teacher self-directed planning, distributed in meaningful increments; 2.5 days for school-directed professional development (.5 of which to be SLT-directed); three days for data culture/analysis.

Notes: SLT to determine which non-student contact days are planning vs. professional. Attendance at centrality offered professional learning is at school leader discretion, but some flexibility decisions will require teacher attendance on these days.
