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6. General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:

The ordinance approves a grant agreement amendment with Denver Neighborhood Revitalization, Inc. (DNRI) to provide for the return of Program Revenue to the City held by the Contractor on February 10, 2012 and any Program Revenue received from the sale of NSP1 properties after this date. This contract was originally executed on October 1, 2009 and was part of the Neighborhood Stabilization Program funding Denver received from the State of Colorado through the Housing and Economic Recovery Act (HERA) of 2008. HERA originally established the NSP and appropriated funds to address the effects of abandoned and foreclosed properties in the nation's communities.

Executive Summary

Purpose: To make minor changes regarding the return of Program Revenue to the City on or before February 10, 2012.

No new funding is requested.

Contract Entity: Denver Neighborhood Revitalization, Inc. (DNRI)

Contract Control Number: GE-94050

Contract Amount: \$1,060,000.00

Program: Neighborhood Stabilization Program 1 (NSP1)

Location: Neighborhoods with high rates of home foreclosures, homes financed by sub-prime mortgages, homes in default or delinquency and abandonment risk; as described by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Neighborhoods included in NSP 1 are: Athmar Park, Barnum, Barnum West, Chaffee Park, Clayton, Cole, College View, East Colfax, Elyria/Swansea, Five Points, Globeville, Green Valley Ranch, Harvey Park, Jefferson Park, Mar Lee, Montbello, Northeast Park Hill, North Park Hill, Ruby Hill, Skyland, Sunnyside, Villa Park, West Colfax, Westwood, and Whittier.

Description:

- Grant Objective: To assist local governments in addressing the effects of abandoned and foreclosed properties in the nation's communities. Eligible activities include:
 - Financing for the purchase and redevelopment of foreclosed residential properties.
 - Purchase and rehabilitation of abandoned homes and residential properties.
 - Redevelopment of vacant properties.
- To amend an existing contract with Denver Neighborhood Revitalization, Inc. to require the return of Program Revenue to the City held by Contractor after February 10, 2012 and any Program Revenue received from the sale of NSP1 properties after that date.

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
