6	WHEREAS, since 1996, the City and County of Denver has administered a			
7	comprehensive program of federally funded Head Start services that delivers high quality early			
8	childhood education, nutrition, health and social development services for low income children			
9	and families in certain areas of the City and County of Denver; and			
10	WHEREAS, the City's Head Start program enables all children, including those of all			
11	races and ethnicities with limited English proficiency or special needs, to enter Kindergarten with			
12	skills, competencies, and self-esteem to be able to succeed; and			
13	WHEREAS, earlier this year, the Denver Head Start Office conducted a competitive			
14	selection process to select contractors as Head Start delegate agencies to provide services and			
15	programs for the 2011-2012 Head Start program year; and			
16	WHEREAS, as a result of the competitive selection process, the Head Start Office has			
17	added an additional contractor to provide services under Denver's Head Start program; and			
18	WHEREAS, there have also been changes to the federal Head Start Act that, under the			
19	Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007, 42 U.S.C. § 9831, which reauthorized			
20	the Head Start program and revised portions of the previous Head Start Act, now require that all			
21	members of a Head Start policy council be elected by parents; and			
22	WHEREAS, in order to comply with the Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of			
23	2007, and to complete program changes resulting from the addition of a new service provider,			
24	Section 2-143 of the D.R.M.C. must be modified to increase the total number of members to the			
25	Denver Head Start Policy Council and to include an election procedure for parents to confirm			
26	appointments made by the Mayor and the City Council;			
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:			
28	SECTION 1. That subsection 2-143.D.4, D.R.M.C. will be amended by deleting the			
29	language stricken and adding the language underlined to read as follows:

- **D.** Head start. An agency currently known as and to be known as the Denver head start office is hereby created as an agency under the mayor's office for education and children.
 - **4.** The policy council. The city head start policy council shall be structured as follows:
 - a. *Membership.* The membership of the Denver head start policy council shall consist of at least nineteen (19) twenty-one (21) members. The members of the Denver head start policy council shall consist of the following two types of representatives: parents of children currently enrolled in Denver head start programs and community representatives.
 - b. Parents. At least ten (10) twelve (12) members of the Denver head start policy council shall be parents of currently enrolled children. Parents of currently enrolled children shall elect all parent members of the Denver head start policy council.
 - **c.** Community representatives. Nine (9) members of the Denver head start policy council shall be community representatives and shall be selected from the following categories:
 - A person who shall be an experienced licensed pediatrician or a person who shall have experience as a professional health care provider;
 - **2.** A certified public accountant;
 - **3.** An attorney;
 - **4.** An individual who shall be experienced in early childhood education:
 - **5.** An individual who shall be experienced in foundations or other charitable award organizations;
 - **6.** An individual who shall be experienced with the operation of nonprofit organizations;
 - **7.** A person who shall be experienced in business;
 - **8.** A parent of a child formerly enrolled in Denver's head start programs;
 - **9.** A person who shall be experienced in finance and/or the management of money; and
 - **10.** A person who shall be experienced in conducting fundraising for nonprofit purposes.
 - **d.** Appointment <u>and election</u> of community representatives. The community representative members of the Denver head start policy council shall be selected as follows:
 - 1. Five (5) community representatives of the Denver head start policy council shall be appointed nominated by the mayor and referred to the Denver head start policy council for election; and
 - 2. Four (4) community representatives of the Denver head start policy council shall be appointed nominated by the city council by ordinance and referred to the Denver head start policy council for election.
