FRANCHISE AGREEMENT: OVERVIEW



WHAT

A franchise agreement is a contract between a municipality and a public utility outlining public benefits and granting the utility the right to use the public right-of-way to install, maintain and repair facilities to serve Denverites.



WHY

The existing franchise agreement between the City and County of Denver and Xcel Energy has a **20**-year term expiring at the end of 2026.

FRANCHISE NEGOTIATION GOALS & BENEFITS

Responsible stewardship of public funds

- ✓ Retain primary right-of-way benefits including utility relocation and franchise fee provisions
- ✓ Preserve strong definition of Public Projects

Strengthened partnership & enhanced service

- ✓ Coordinated and proactive infrastructure & capacity planning
- ✓ Reflect modern energy conservation and assistance regulations & services

Accelerate renewable energy transition

- ✓ Establish Denver Development Innovation Group (DDIG)
- ✓ Advance clean energy infrastructure

Benefits to Denverites

- Utility relocation clause saved Denver
 over \$3 billion in non-airport
 construction costs over current term
- Franchise fee generates over \$30
 million a year for Denver's General
 Fund (3% of annual revenues)
- Undergrounding fee generates over \$10 million a year to underground Denver transmission lines (1% of annual revenues)

Approval of Denver's new gold standard Franchise Agreements



CCD & Xcel Energy Franchise Agreement

Requires Council, Public Voter, and Public Utility Commission Approval

• Ordinance 25-0922 refers the Franchise Agreement to Denver Voters



Denver International Airport Operating Agreement



Requires Council Approval

• *Ordinance 25-0987* approves the DEN Operating Agreement

DOTI respectfully requests **Denver City Council approval** of the CCD Franchise Agreement and DEN **Operating Agreement,** marking another step forward in re-securing Denver's Gold standard Franchise Agreement and its significant benefits to Denverites.



DRAFT Ballot Referral Language

Shall the City and County of Denver approve the terms of a twenty-year franchise contract, starting January 1, 2027, with Public Service Company of Colorado (Xcel Energy) to continue its program for undergrounding overhead electrical lines, maintaining infrastructure safety, and partnering with the City for emergency management coordination, and to require that Xcel Energy continue to pay the City for reasonable use of public rights-of-way and other City property necessary to provide safe and reliable utility services for the benefit of the City, its residents, and its businesses?
