First, it is part of a tri-annual cycle that CPD and DFD follow to ensure the city remains current on life-safety regulations that are founded and vetted through rigorous consensus-based processes at the national level. Adoption of contemporary codes supports Denver's ISO rating and maintenance of reasonable insurance rates across the city. It also provides consistent foundational documents for the design and construction of projects within our jurisdiction. The second purpose of the ordinance and code update focuses on regulatory reduction (by about 30%) of local amendments to the nationally developed codes. This makes design and development clearer and less prone to errors, improving the expediency of review compliance and inspections to get buildings in Denver built and occupied faster.
