The Denver Fire Department of the City and County of Denver is donating expired extrication and fire protective equipment to Bomberos Voluntarios de San Pedro, Coahuila, Mexico. The list of expired equipment includes:

Extrication Equipment

- 12 Spreaders
- 12 Power Unit
- 8 Cutters
- 13 Rams

Personal Protective Equipment

- 31 NXG2 Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Packs
- 5 Sets of Jackets and Pants Bunking Personal Protective Gear

The Denver Fire Department adheres to a replacement cycle for capital equipment based on safety requirements for operational and personal protective equipment. The listed items were primarily inherited from mergers with other fire departments and have vastly exceeded their expiration dates. Although the listed items no longer meet the required National Fire Protection Administration (NFPA) guidelines followed by DFD, they are still functional and would be of great value to the Bomberos Voluntarios de San Pedro, Coahuila, Mexico.

The Bomberos Voluntarios de San Pedro, Coahuila, Mexico have 21 active volunteer firefighters serving 192,000 residents. They respond to approximately 3,200 structural fires, auto accidents and EMS calls annually. The volunteer firefighters also have a partnership with the local Red Cross and have 5 firefighters currently assigned to their unit to provide continual assistance to reduce COVID spread, as vaccinations are still limited in this and other regions of Mexico. They are a self-funded department

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subsisting on fundraising efforts from their volunteer firefighters and occasional in-kind donations of businesses and residents. The firefighting and protective equipment obtained by the department is limited and also extremely outdated including only having 2 SCBA's from 1995. The donation of items from the Denver Fire Department would assist their community needs for emergency response and go a long way in helping them protect the life and safety of their residents. Additionally, DFD needs the limited storage space at the Training Academy for the upcoming recruit classes, making this mutually beneficial opportunity.

The estimated surplus value of the equipment proposed to be donated is \$1,170.
