1 BY AUTHORITY 2 COUNCIL BILL NO. __ ORDINANCE NO. 3 COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE: SERIES OF 2015 4 5 A BILL 6 for an ordinance amending Sections 2-191, 2-193 and 2-195 of Article 7 VIII of Chapter 2 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City and County 8 of Denver to delete certain provisions which shall be, and hereby are relocated to Division 4, Section 39-88 of Article II of Chapter 39 of the 9 10 Revised Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER: 13 Section 1. That Section 2-191, "Arts and venues Denver", of the Revised 14 Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding language underlined and deleting language 15 stricken as follows: 16 17 Arts and venues Denver shall be the division of general services responsible for operations 18 of all facilities, structures, or parts of structures owned or leased by the City and County 19 and used for theatre, concert, auditorium, convention, or arena purposes, for management 20 of the City and County cultural and arts events, and for administration of the public art 21 program and for issuance of film permits and coordination of special event permits, creative sector development programs, and all related duties as described in this division. 22 23 The division of arts and venues Denver may perform other duties assigned by the manager 24 of general services not inconsistent with the Charter or the Code. 25 26 That Section 2-193(1) through (20), "Powers and duties", of the 27 Revised Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding language underlined and deleting 28 language stricken as follows: 29 30 (1) Work with the mayor, the city council, and all affected or interested departments. 31 commissions, boards, officers, offices, agencies and employees of the city in cultural 32 development activities and in operation and management of theatre, concert, 33 auditorium, convention or arena venues; and 34 35 (2) Coordinate the activities of contractors and coordinate the various departments. commissions, boards, officers, offices, agencies and employees of the city in the 36

preparation of those activities; and

1 (3) Review and analyze provisions of ordinances, rules, executive orders and other 2 regulatory documents that may affect film-making or other artistic activity in the city and 3 advise the mayor and city council; and 4 5 (4) Administer the city's public art program, whereby a portion of capital 6 improvement resource is utilized for public art; and 7 8 (5) Attract creative businesses and operations to Denver; and 9 10 (6) Coordinate film and special event permitting in the city; and 11 12 (67) Act as liaison between the city and the Colorado creative industries or its state-13 authorized successor; and 14 15 (78) Assist the Denver district county cultural council and the Denver metropolitan 16 scientific and cultural facilities district with administration and distribution of revenues 17 under state law; and 18 19 Encourage the utilization of creative local professionals and businesses; and (89)20 21 (910) Coordinate the efforts of arts and venues in assisting increasing tourism and visitorship in the city; and 22 23 24 (1011) Provide technical assistance and information to arts and cultural and film-groups 25 concerning funding, grants, loans, and other forms of assistance available to them; and 26 27 (1112) Promote the venues and arts of the city to connect community members and 28 visitors with Denver's arts and entertainment sector; and 29 30 (1213) Encourage the incorporation of art in privately funded activities and capital 31 improvements; and 32 33 (1314) Work with the departments designated by Charter to acquire and construct all 34 facilities, structures, or parts of structures owned or leased by the City and County and 35 used for theatre, concert, auditorium or arena purposes; and 36 37 (1415) Maintain, repair, manage and operate all facilities, structures, or parts of

structures owned or leased by the city and county and used for theatre, concert,

22	The arts and venues Denver director is hereby delegated the authority to review			
23	applications for a permit to allow filming operations upon the following terms and			
24	conditions:			
25	(1) Upon receipt of an application for a film operations permit, the following actions			
26	are taken:			
27	A) Arts and venues Denver shall notify and coordinate specific details with			
28	affected city department(s) including, but not limited to, the permitting division of			
29	the department of public works and parks and recreation, the Denver Police			
30	Department, and the Denver Fire Department. Notification for significant			
31	productions will also include council members within whose district the proposed			
32	filming will take place and neighborhood organizations within whose district the			
33	proposed filming will take place; and			
34				
35	B) A certificate of insurance in the face amount of not less than one million			
36	dollars (\$1,000,000.00) showing coverage for general liability, including the			
37	operations under the permit and showing the City and County of Denver and			
38	specific Denver departments as additionally insured. Exemptions to the			
39	insurance requirements may be granted by arts and venues Denver, in			

1	consultation with Denver's Risk Management Office, for filming by
2	noncommercial, educational, charitable, and public service organizations.
3	
4	(2) The applicant shall, under determined conditions, distribute leaflets at least forty-
5	eight (48) hours prior to the proposed filming operations explaining the proposed
6	operations to inform adjoining residents and businesses located within two hundred
7	(200) feet of the proposed filming site or sites. The leaflet shall contain the phone
8	number of the production company and arts and venues Denver. Arts and venues
9	Denver may, in its sole discretion, shorten this notice period or waive this requirement
10	entirely if an applicant has sufficiently demonstrated that the filming operations will not
11	unduly disturb the neighborhood or affected businesses.
12	
13	(3) Arts and venues Denver shall establish Film and TV Production Rules and
14	Regulations. Compliance by filming operations shall be mandatory. Immediately upon
15	formal notification to the production company by arts and venues Denver, the film
16	permit may be cancelled if there is a failure to comply with the rules and regulations and
17	all operations allowed by the permit may be ordered to cease.
18	
19	(4) Film permits shall state on their face the duration of the filming. Filming at any
20	one location shall not exceed fourteen (14) calendar days. A permit may be extended
21	by arts and venues Denver, to allow filming to exceed this 14-calendar-day limit upon
22	the determination that additional time is necessary, that appropriate notifications are
23	given and that operations are in compliance with the rules and regulations.
24	
25	(5) Arts and venues Denver director may add conditions to the permit, to protect the
26	safety and comfort of the neighborhood in which the filming is taking place. If a filming
27	permit is denied, an appeal shall be reviewed by the director of the arts and venues
28	Denver in accordance with the guidelines set under rules and regulations.
29	
30	(6) Arts and venues Denver shall refuse to grant a film permit to any applicant which
31	has not obtained necessary permits from other departments of the City and County of
32	Denver.
33	
34	Section 4. Division 4 of Article II, Chapter 39 of the Revised Municipal Code is
35 36	hereby renamed to be "Extraordinary Events and Film Permits".
37	Section 5. Division 4 of Article II, Chapter 39 of the Revised Municipal Code is
38	hereby revised by adding a new Section 39-88 to read as follows:

The Mayor or Mayor's designee is hereby delegated the authority to review applications for

- a permit to allow filming operations under the following terms and conditions on city-owned
 or operated property:
- 3 (1) Upon receipt of an application for a film operations permit, the following actions are taken:
 - A) The mayor or designee shall notify and coordinate specific details with affected city department(s) including, but not limited to, the permitting division of the department of public works and parks and recreation, the Denver Police Department, and the Denver Fire Department. Notification for significant productions will also include council members within whose district the proposed filming will take place and neighborhood organizations within whose district the proposed filming will take place; and

B) A certificate of insurance as required by the film and video rules and regulations showing coverage for general liability, including the operations under the permit and showing the City and County of Denver as additionally insured. Exemptions to the insurance requirements may be granted by the Mayor or designee, in consultation with Denver's Risk Management Office, and any adopted policy of the office of special events.

(2) The applicant shall, pursuant to the film and video production rules and regulations, provide notice of the proposed filming operations. The mayor or designee may, in its sole discretion, waive this requirement entirely if an applicant has sufficiently demonstrated that the filming operations will not unduly disturb the neighborhood or affected businesses.

(3) The mayor or designee shall establish film and video production rules and regulations. Compliance by filming operations shall be mandatory. Immediately upon formal notification to the production company by the mayor or designee, the film permit may be revoked if there is a failure to comply with the film and video production rules and regulations and all operations allowed by the permit may be ordered to cease.

34 (4) The mayor or designee may add conditions to the permit, to protect the safety
35 and comfort of the neighborhood in which the filming is taking place. If a filming permit
36 is denied, an appeal shall be reviewed by the mayor or designee in accordance with the
37 guidelines set under the film and video production rules and regulations.

(5) The mayor or designee may refuse to grant a film permit to any applicant which has not obtained necessary permits from other departments of the City and County of Denver,
