11	WHEREAS, in 2006, the City Council enacted Ordinance No. 760, Series of 2006,
12	establishing an ordinance for a Minority and Women Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) contracting
13	ordinance in furtherance of nondiscrimination in city contracts for construction, reconstruction and
14	remodeling and professional design and construction services and for the utilization of Small
15	Business Enterprises (SBE) in City contracting and concessions; and
16	WHEREAS, passage of Ordinance No. 760, Series of 2006, was based, in part, on a study
17	of availability and utilization of woman- and minority-owned business enterprises in construction,
18	reconstruction and remodeling, and professional design and construction services; and
19	WHEREAS, the City has now commissioned another study to determine if the conditions
20	originally justifying the enactment of the MBE/WBE and SBE programs, pursuant to Ordinance No.
21	760, Series of 2006, still exist; and
22	WHEREAS, under the current sunset provision of the Minority Business Enterprise and
23	Women Business Enterprise ordinance (codified at Section 28-83(b) of the Revised Municipal
24	Code), the MBE/WBE program is set to expire on June 30, 2013; and
25	WHEREAS, under the current sunset provision of the SBE ordinance (codified at Section
26	28-234(b) of the Revised Municipal Code), the SBE program is set to expire on June 30, 2013; and
27	WHEREAS, the City has commissioned another study to determine if the conditions
28	originally justifying the enactment of the MBE/WBE and SBE programs, pursuant to Ordinance No.
29	760, Series of 2006, still exist; and

30 WHEREAS, a temporary extension of the respective sunset periods for an additional six (6)

months is necessary to complete the additional studies and an administrative review of these
programs, and to make a determination of whether any reauthorizations, adjustments or revisions
to Division 3 of Article III or Article VII of Chapter 28 are necessary; and

4	WHEREAS, this periodic review and sunsetting of such ordinances is supported by
5	Concrete Works of Colorado, Inc. v. City and County of Denver, 823 F.Supp. 821, 843 (D.Colo.
6	1993), rev'd on other grounds, 36 F.3d 1513 (10th Cir. 2003); and Adarand Constructors, Inc. v.
7	<i>Slater,</i> 228 F.3d 1147, 1179 (10 <sup>th</sup> Cir. 2000) (quoting <i>U.S. v. Paradise</i> , 480 U.S. 149, 178 (1987));
