Attach executive summary if more space needed:</li> <li>This bill removes the sunset date for the common consumption area licensing program in Denver. The program was originally approved by City Council in 2019, and because effective in 2021 after the department adopted agency rules. The licensing program was created as a five-year pilot program to gauge interest in the city. Since the program began, the department has received only one application for a common consumption area license, indicating demand for the program, but not oversaturation of this type of license. Repeal of the sunset will allow this license to issue and continue operation beyond 2026. It will also allow for the creation of additional Entertainment Districts in the future if pursued by license applicants. This bill is co-sponsored by Council Member Watson.</li> <li>6.
