**~~A. Personal Statement~~**

As the Director of Public Health Interventions at CHN, I lead and direct all public health interventions under the Colorado Health Network's Community Engagement Department with a focus on evidence-based projects designed to improve public health outcomes and reduce inequities, including our Healthy Aging and HIV Programs, Youth and HIV Programs, and PrEP accessibility strategies. I have been with the organization since January 2017 when I started out as a Health Access Coordinator, helping People Living with HIV (PLWH) enroll in insurance plans. This particular role inspired me to continue my path in community advocacy; I realized how critical health literacy was to PLWH because it empowered them to understand and better navigate systems that were designed within oppressive and discriminatory frameworks. In Jan 2018, I was promoted to manage the PrEP financial assistance program for the state of Colorado known as PHIP, or the Public Health Intervention Program. Through this role, I spearheaded my passion for PrEP advocacy by educating navigators and patients across the entire state of Colorado in PrEP infrastructure. Mirroring my earlier Health Access work, my goal as a sexual health advocate has been to make systems more understandable to the average person who can then feel prepared to identify their needs and locate resources to sustain those needs.

As a person on PrEP in a serodiscordant relationship, HIV advocacy has been at the heart of my career and will continue to inform and shape my path. In 2020, I was able to speak on behalf of a new law in Colorado that allowed pharmacists to dispense PrEP and nPEP. I was also one of two individuals who attended every regulation hearing under Colorado's Division of Insurance to ensure USPSTF regulations were interpreted as broadly and inclusively as possible. In short, I am dedicated to the world of HIV prevention and its scientific breakthroughs' capacity to change the world.
