**A BILL**

**For an ordinance amending sub-section 11 of section 39-121 of the Revised Municipal Code changing various fees and charges for recreation centers and adding sub-paragraph e. regarding consumer price index adjustments.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** That subsection 11 (Recreation center/facility fees) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language and numbers stricken and adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

**39-121.** (11) *Recreation center/facility fees:*

a. Resident and non-resident fees based on designation of recreation center type as a neighborhood, local or regional facility. Membership fees includes drop-in gym, indoor and outdoor pools, game rooms, weight rooms, and selected drop-in fitness classes subject to posted rules; additionally, holders may register for classes and programs for which there will be a separate charge.

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5. The manager of parks and recreation may assess reasonable service charges for electronic fund transfer payments made on a monthly basis.

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6. A holder of an annual membership or a 15-visits or 30-visits card may utilize any recreation center of a designation type lower than the annual membership or 15-visits or 30-visits card purchased by the holder.

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7. A holder of an annual membership or a 15-visits or 30-visits card will be assessed an additional charge of two dollars (\$2) for each day the holder wishes to utilize a recreation center of one designation type higher or an additional charge of four dollars (\$4) for each day the holder wishes to utilize a recreation center of two designation types higher than the annual membership or 15-visits or 30-visits card purchased by the holder.

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8 5. The manager of parks and recreation may establish ~~punch card and other~~ payment systems for the convenience of members in paying established fees, passes, and the like.

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9. The manager of parks and recreation may temporarily reduce the fees set out in this sub-section a. for promotional purposes.

- (d) Scoreboard rental: \$54.00 per rental.
- (e) Damage deposit: \$200.00.
- (f) Damages deposit for gymnasiums with scoreboard rental: \$500.00.

- 1 (g) Cancellation fee: 7 days or more prior to event: 50% of total  
2 rental fee.  
3 Less than 7 days prior to event: 100% of total rental fee.

- 4 (h) Overtime penalty charge: hourly rate.

- 5 d. Special fees: The manager of parks and recreation may establish special  
6 rates, procedures for full or partial scholarships, or conditions for individuals,  
7 groups or special parties.  
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10 e. Consumer Price Index Adjustment. On or about July 1, 2013 and annually thereafter,  
11 and after consultation with City Council committee, the fees and charges set out in this sub-  
12 section 11 of section 39-121 of the Denver revised municipal code (as amended from time  
13 to time) may be adjusted, in an amount equal to the percentage change from the previous  
14 year in the CPI-U (rounded to the nearest dollar). The adjustments will be reflected in a fee  
15 and charge schedule issued by the manager of parks and recreation and made publicly  
16 available in advance of the fees and charges becoming effective. The percentage change to  
17 be applied to the rates shall be calculated as follows:  
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CPI for current period  
Less CPI for previous period  
Equals index point change  
Divided by previous period CPI  
Equals result multiplied by 100  
Equals percent change

19 CPI-U means the United States Department of Labor Statistics (Bureau of Labor Statistics)  
20 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, All Items, for the Denver-Boulder-Greeley,  
21 Colorado metropolitan area (1982-84-100). In the event that the CPI-U is substantially changed,  
22 re-named, or abandoned by the United States Government, then in its place shall be substituted  
23 the index established by the United States Government that most closely resembles the CPI-U.
