  - a. Scope of Work

The City periodically submits applications to the Colorado Petroleum Storage Tank Fund for reimbursement of City expenses incurred during remediation of petroleum contamination. To date, the City has received \$680,838.86 in connection with remediation activities at the City's Fire Station 28 site located at 4306 S. Wolff Street, Denver, Colorado. An application of \$142,123.58 will be made to the Fund upon approval of this ordinance, and future Fund applications are anticipated for this site. The ordinance will allow the City to accept the \$142,123.58 currently applied for and additional amounts up to the statutory limits. The City anticipates seeking future reimbursement of expenses not to exceed the current statutory limits of \$2,000,000 for this site under the Statute.
